Safety at the gates

Apologies for the late opening of the playground gates this morning- totally my fault

All parents are kindly asked to leave as soon as you have dropped off to avoid crowding in the playground.

Year 1 and 2 the playground gate

Always drop older children first and then make your way to reception – and then leave by the reception gate. This limits the crossing of people within the school grounds
